#### Pastor's Note – Lent 2022

Sitting on a table in our living room is a book called "Disciplines 2022." It's a collection of daily devotions from the Upper Room Publishing House that my wife and I have been going through together each evening. On the cover of this devotional is the trunk of a birch tree, a tree that has always intrigued me when I've encountered it in nature, mainly due to the way its outer layer of bark sheds, and how different its smooth texture underneath feels in comparison to other trees.

As I look upon the birch tree on the book cover, which, like many found in nature, is peeling away, I am reminded of Lent as a time for us to do some shedding, peeling away outer layers to reveal something surprising and beautiful underneath. The things we peel away could be things that have become idols, temptations, or distractions; things that have become hindrances to our relationship with God in some way, whether big or small. As a way to engage in this practice of shedding, many will choose to give up a particular food during Lent like sugar, meat or dairy, or a drink like coffee or soda. Some may even choose to engage in the discipline of fasting at times or on a regular basis.

Some may choose to give up television or video games, social media or listening to the news. Some may choose to give up a convenience they are used to that they struggle to live without. Some may even strive to shed worry or complaining from their life.

As I look at the cover of the book, I am also reminded of the heavy things we would like to shed, but that don't seem to be going away. The pandemic is one reality we have wanted to shed like a wool coat on a hot summer day; to peel away the pain, grief, and frustration that have come with this difficult and ongoing reality. We would like our prayers for Ukraine to shed off the violence and the fear that so many are experiencing. We would like the injustices within the systems and structures we are immersed in to fall away. We would like some digits to be shed off from the gas prices and food that have been rising to an increasing measure. And yet, there are certain things that remain, even though we'd like them to be removed.

Much is in store for this season of Lent. Aside from our special services on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday, we have a special joint church Lenten study on Thursdays at 7pm at Boonton UMC in which we'll be journeying through Dietrich Bonhoeffer's "Meditations on the Cross." We'll have a Sunday sermon series for the first five weeks of Lent called "Familiar Words for an Unfamiliar Time" as we journey through the Lord's Prayer together section by section in this new postpandemic landscape we are emerging from. And much more is on the horizon.

As trees grow, their bark must give somehow. In oaks, the outer bark splits and cracks, while the smooth bark of a birch peels off. But, however we shed, we too, like the trees seen all around us, are called to expand, growing more each passing day. May this also be the case for you this Lent.

#### **Church Roof Update**

In April of 2016, recognizing the need to replace the roof on the church in about five years, a \$40,000 church roof fund campaign began. We are now happy to be able to tell you that the church roof has been replaced. The job was started on November 15, 2021 and completed on November 20, 2021; five and a half years after the campaign began.

The total cost of the roof replacement project was \$55,453. This cost included the required removal and replacement of the lightning protection system, use of a CLASS 4 shingle required by our insurance company, replacing an area of soffit and 9 sheets of plywood, and also several sheets of insulation that go over the sanctuary area of the building. Also, a 50 year Owens/Corning Platinum Warranty was purchased. This warranty also covers the workmanship of Carlson estimate Brothers Roofing, including if Carlson Bros is not available to do any future repairs or corrections, then Owens/Corning Co. will take care of providing for the repairs. All of the above were not included in the original \$40,000 that was made approximately 5 years ago.

At the time the project was paid for, the total contributions received from faithful members and friends was \$41,179, with a deficit of \$14,274 paid for by the Trustees. How blessed we are that we actually reached the goal that was set in 2016. Contributions that we continue to receive for the roof fund are being applied to the deficit.

Montville United Methodist continues to be an active and vibrant presence in Montville Township, doing God's work in serving our community and others. We thank you all for your continued support.

While we may still be in a pandemic and wearing our masks each Sunday, our Sunday school classes continue to meet each week thanks to the dedication and commitment from some of our church members.
